Lorraine Injie spoke to the meeting.

Wangka Maya Language Centre has been open since 1987.

Lorraine has been chair for the past 6 years. Lorraine thanked the outgoing committee for all their work and introduced the staff to the meeting.

Lorraine stated that they have always tried to get committee members who speak language.

It is the responsibility of the chairperson to attend meetings on behalf of the organisation; Lorraine thanked Denese for standing in on these meetings for WM.

Lorraine explained to the meeting that WM staff and committee attended a meeting with other WA language centres during the year. All the centres there agreed to make a stand opposed to FATSIL as funding has not changed over the past many years except for the Stolen Generation dollars. Also that FATSIL did not in fact represent our language centres. WM and other language centres want more of the bucket of money, as compared with Eastern states who have less languages than us, and we have some languages close to extinction eg Martuthunira and Putijarra.

WM continues to ask the government for more dollars to pay old people and linguists so languages don't miss out.

Languages need to be taught to kids and community needs to use language more. Wangka is crucial to Aboriginal identity. WM will continue to keep working to get more funding.

Lorraine stated that extra funding has allowed WM to buy new computers and pay extra staff which allowed more projects to be completed than in the past.

Lorraine stated that WM needs more help from the community to continue to do the language work required.
